Topic of the Month

Winter and Calves

Winter seems to be a time when calves frequently require extra attention. The cold adds a complicating factor to common calf-hood diseases. This would be a good time to review a few principles regarding treatment of calves.

As usual, ventilation and nutrition are key. Extra feedings or feeding increased volumes can be helpful, but must be done carefully. Increasing the amount of milk replacer powder in the same volume of water can result in the concentration of solids being too high. This can cause a stomach upset or diarrhea. Adding electrolytes directly to milk will have the same effect and may make diarrhea worse.

Treating scouring calves also needs to address fluid losses. It may not be enough to just give two quarts of electrolyte solution because that's how the packets are sold. A calf needs to replace the fluids it loses in the scours plus what it loses through the steam in its breath, its urine, as well as its normal maintenance requirement of fluids. This can be very intensive and may require several treatments throughout the day. These calves may also have acid base imbalances that require treatment with sodium bicarbonate.
