Topic of the Month

Twins

We all know that twins are unwelcome in cattle. Twin pregnancies often result in severe complications for the cow and the stillbirth and abortion rates are also increased for twin pregnancies. In addition, heifer calves born twin to a bull calf are likely to be sterile due to freemartinism.

Nobody likes a diagnosis of twins at pregnancy check, but there are some strategies to lessen the risk for the cow if we know they are carrying twins. First, recheck the pregnancy after 60 days since bred since the late embryonic death rate is high in twin pregnancies, especially if both pregnancies are in the same side of the uterus.

Second, dry the cow off early. An extra 2 weeks can make a tremendous difference in the cow's condition at freshening. If you feed a close up group, you can dry the cow with twins off into the close up group directly.

Third, if the twins are in different sides of the uterus and the cow is under 42 days bred at diagnosis, it is possible to pinch a vesicle, eliminating one of the pregnancies. Unfortunately, about 40% of these cows will lose the other pregnancy too. Depending on the degree of complications in your cows that freshen with twins, it may be a risk worth taking.
